Details

- This day trip will bring us into the rural area of the Ore Mountains. Starting with a train ride from Chemnitz main station in the morning, we will hike to the small village Dörnthal (approx. 12km) for visiting the oldest still producing oil mill in Germany since 1650.
- On our route we will come along lakes of the Revierwasserlaufanstalt Freiberg as former parts of the silver mining in the region. For example, "Buttermilchgetzen" and "Klitscher" as typical regional meals will refill our energy at lunch so that we can continue our journey in the afternoon to Olbernhau by Bus.
- After a short walk through the city, we will finish our tour by visiting the "Saigerhütte" Museum and the old "Kupferhammer", a World Heritage Site (last intercession: at 4 p.m.). The dinner will be in the "Hüttenschänke" and our trip will be finished by the train trip back to Chemnitz at around 9 pm.
- Please make sure you wear weatherproof clothing, sturdy shoes and sufficient sun protection in hot weather.
